Areas of success

LCS students consistently perform well on provincial achievement tests in Grade 6. Though the percentage of students meeting the standard of excellence declined, the students meeting at least an acceptable standard increased. The LCS community also rates our citizenship measures high. Teaching and leading is also rated high at LCS.

Areas for growth

A key area for improvement is increasing parental involvement. Given certain constraints of the data collected (surveying 2 grade levels only), it is worthwhile gathering more information and looking at ways to highlight current methods of parental involvement and to brainstorm ways to increase parental involvement moving forward.

Evaluation

Teachers have consistently rated student citizenship very high over the past five years. While student perceptions of citizenship have improved compared to the previous year, parent perceptions have declined.

Citizenship is continually addressed during whole-school chapels, held twice a week, and integrated into the curriculum, particularly in health and social studies classes. To further enhance this area, we should consider highlighting students who exemplify good citizenship and raising awareness of existing good citizenship within the community.

Evaluation

Some of the decline in parent's perspective could be improved through better communication of learning that takes place in the classrooms. This could be through direct messaging or posted in public places like hallways, in the gym for special events, or online. Students in grade 4 were more likely to less engagement with learning than students in grade 7.

Evaluation

Despite many students not finding their learning highly engaging, the majority were satisfied with the overall quality of basic instruction. There was a slight decrease in the percentage of parents satisfied with the overall quality of basic instruction. This issue could be addressed by improving communication with parents about their children's learning experiences.

Evaluation

The significant decline in the percentage of parents who agree that learning environments are welcoming, caring, respectful, and safe is concerning. Data indicates that while parents trust that teachers care about students and treat them fairly, they are concerned about the behavior of other students. Addressing this issue will require intentional and proactive communication with parents.

Last year, we initiated a homework club that may have been underutilized due to insufficient communication with stakeholders. Additionally, there has been a lack of consistency in the wellness team. We are now working to provide more consistent wellness support for students.
